What is the situation on Ostrava's real estate and development market?

Representatives of the City meet regularly with large developers. This time, we decided to hold a meeting with smaller investors and developers at the new Clubco centre to discuss the residential market in Ostrava. The discussion also focused on land owned by the City that is currently being offered for sale. See here for more information.



The Technology Park in Pustkovec is set to expand further

The City has begun negotiations with the developer CTP on the planned expansion of the T-Park. A new building (T6) will be located on a site with a total area of 14 397 m2. The building will offer over 24 000 m2 of usable area for offices and prototype workshops, including testing rooms, technical workshops, labs etc. Pedestrian access through the site to the Poruba Forest Park will be retained, and a public access road and parking spaces will also be built. Vitesco Technologies will open a new factory in Ostrava

Vitesco Technologies, a leading international manufacturer of modern drive technologies and electrification solutions, will open a new factory with a fully automated logistics centre in Ostrava-Hrušov at the end of this year. The investment will cost over 4.7 bn CZK.

The OSTRAVA ARENA is set for a major modernization

Ostrava's largest indoor arena is starting to show its age, and a technical study commissioned by the City has concluded that the most effective solution will be to modernize the arena as a venue for various events without an ice rink, and to build an entirely **new ice stadium** on a separate site. **See here** for more information.



Vítkovice railway station and Ostrava's main station will both be renovated

The Ostrava-Vítkovice railway station, a listed heritage site built in 1967, is set to undergo a complete renovation which will include a reconfiguration of the interior space for commercial use. The project will be implemented in collaboration with the Vítkovice municipal district. Work is scheduled to begin in April 2024.

The National Rail Authority is also planning a



station, which will be coordinated with the City's plans to revitalize the exterior space outside the station. In December 2021 the City announced a public tender for this revitalization project, and the winning bid was submitted jointly by the architectural studio CASUA and the construction consultancy company AFRY CZ. The project will include the creation of a new terminal for city and regional public transport, a new underground parking garage, and improvements to the public spaces outside the passenger building. Now we know who will build the new concert hall

Ostrava has chosen the contractor for Phase 2 of the project to renovate the City of Ostrava Cultural Centre and build a brandnew concert hall. The winning bid was submitted by a consortium consisting of the contractors **IMOS Brno and IPS Třinec**, who offered the lowest price. Construction work is scheduled for completion in 2027. **See here** for more information.



The conversion of Ostrava's historic city slaughterhouse to create a new home for the PLATO contemporary art gallery has progressed to the final round of the European Union Prize for Contemporary Architecture – Mies van der Rohe Award – one of just seven projects to reach this stage of the competition, and the first-ever Czech building to be ranked among the finalists. The conversion was designed by Polish architect Robert Konieczny's KWK Promes studio. The slaughterhouse

complex was established in 1881. See here

Work is beginning on a new parking garage for 600 cars

A new parking garage with two underground and eight above-ground levels will be built **next to the Regional Authority offices**. Its ingenious interior configuration will ensure efficient traffic flow and make maximum use of the available space.
